WORKING TOGETHER IN SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY


The Rotary Club of Euroa recently donated an additional \$15,000 to the Euroa Health Building Appeal, bringing the total donated by the Club to \$40,000. The Building Appeal seeks \$500,000 in local donations by December 2017 to complete the GraniteHill Aged Care Facility on Kennedy Street.

In presenting the cheque, Rotary President David Rutledge said “It is the very nature of Rotary to support our local community, and obviously we see this development as critically important to Euroa.”

The 75 bed residential facility is Euroa’s largest development for decades, made possible with a funding commitment from the Federal Government of \$11,620,000. To this, the Board of Euroa Health has committed funds from reserves and income.

Member of the Euroa Health Board and Chair of the Appeal Committee, Jim Shovelton, thanked Rotary. “We had to balance the offer of funding from the Commonwealth and the need for improved premises against the fact that we had a funding shortfall that was yet to be secured. The Public Appeal is going well, and we are now over the half-way mark towards our target of raising \$500,000 locally” he said. “There is a long way to go, and your very significant assistance helps enormously” he said.

“This is a major grant in anyone’s book” said Mr Shovelton. You were with us from the start of this undertaking, and on behalf of the Board of Euroa Health and its Appeal Committee, I thank the Rotary Club of Euroa for this donation.”
