The Oxalis Wind Quintet will perform live at the Old Flour Mill Gallery on Sunday afternoon July 3 from 2pm to 4pm.

The group performs music written for the classical wind quintet which consists of Flute, Oboe, Clarinet, Bassoon and Horn. Members of the Quintet hail from various locations in central Victoria, and make themselves available to present high quality concerts as fundraisers – in this case, for the Euroa Health Building Fund.

“We are very pleased to undertake this concert for such an important community project” said Flutist, Sandy Sexton. “We have worked with Janet at the Old Flour Mill Gallery before, and know the gallery to have a generous acoustic.
