MAKE IT HAPPEN

Euroa stock agents have met to reach agreement on a simple system to allow farmers to donate stock to benefit the Euroa Health Building Appeal.

Farmers selling sheep or cattle will be able to donate the proceeds from the sale of one or more animals to the Building Appeal to see GraniteHill Aged Care Facility completed. “If a farmer is selling a pen of 30 lambs, they can tell me to donate the sale of any number of those lambs – say 3 lambs - to Euroa Health” said Landmark agent, Russell Mawson. When we do the paperwork after the sale, the farmer is credited 27 lambs, and Euroa Health’s Building Appeal is credited the value of 3 lambs” he said. “It’s simple – and we will not take commission.”

Landmark, Rodwells and Elders have all agreed on the same system. “This is good news” said Appeal Committee Chairman, Jim Shovelton. “I’m very grateful that the agents have shown such support, and to not take commission is a bonus for the Appeal” he said.

“We all just want to make it happen” said Rodwells stock agent, Mick Curtis. This way, every farmer will be able to stick with their usual agent and just give us the nod to help the Appeal”.

“Whether it is through the yards or over the hooks, we will make it happen” said Mick.
